FSYF High School Re-Entry Program 'Fitting in Fast'

Friday, August 28, 6pm - 9pm at Oakwood Falls Church

Each August, FSYF hosts a High School Re-Entry Program aimed at teens entering grades 9-12. The program is designed for high school students in the foreign affairs agency communities who are returning from abroad, moving to the U.S. for the first time, or still struggling with re-entry issues after an earlier move. This interactive program, featuring a panel of experienced Foreign Service teens, encourages students to identify and address their questions and concerns about teen social culture and high school life in the DC area while developing a support network of FS peers. We are excited to have Sarah Novak, certified Life Coach and EFM, moderate this year, along with Dr. Jim Brush from the Department of State's Child and Family Program.

FSYF Middle School Re-Entry Program 'Taking Charge'

Sunday, August 30, 2pm - 4pm at Oakwood Falls Church

Starting in 2014, FSYF added a Middle School Re-Entry program for youth in grades 6-8. This program is designed for Middle school students in the foreign affairs agency communities who are returning from abroad, moving to the U.S. for the first time, or still struggling with re-entry issues after an earlier move. This interactive program encourages students to identify and address questions and concerns about middle school, while developing a network of local FS peers. This program is moderated by Sarah Novak, Certified Life Coach and EFM, along with Dr. Jim Brush from the Department of State's Child and Family Program.
