

**FSI YOUTH PROGRAM 2012
PART-TIME WORK OPPORTUNITIES FOR FS YOUTH**

The Transition Center at the Foreign Service Institute, Arlington, Virginia is seeking Foreign Service high school seniors or college students with recent overseas experience for temporary paid part time Teacher's Aide positions for our summer Youth Program.

The assignments are only for the specific dates mentioned herein. Preference will be given to applicants who can work on all dates of the program.

Background:

Young Diplomats Day (YDD) is a one-day introduction to the world of diplomacy for children of USG employees assigned abroad. Children in grades two through twelve participate in a variety of activities and open discussion in age-appropriate classrooms (elementary, middle and high school).

Youth Security Overseas Seminar (YSOS) is a one-day training for children in grades two through twelve. Children explore safety and security threats they might face in an overseas environment and identify resources to protect themselves. Together, YDD and YSOS are a two-day diplomatic training program for Foreign Service kids.

These trainings will be offered six times during the summer:

June 18-19, June 25-26, July 9-10, July 16-17, July 23-24, and August 6-7.

Teacher's Aides

Prior to the yearly training program, the YDD/YSOS teacher's aide will:

- Attend a half-day orientation program before the first offering of the course to get familiarized with the curriculum and to be introduced to all members of the training team.

During the scheduled training, the YDD/YSOS teacher's aide will:

- Assist the teacher in presenting the training material provided by the Transition Center.
- Attend periodic end-of-day de-briefing meetings to share information about classroom events.
- Work hours are from 8:15 am - 4:30 pm

Salary

A \$100.00 stipend is paid for each day worked. No payment is possible for attending the Orientation meeting.

To apply

Candidates should submit an application to Laura Miller MillerLE@state.gov with their resume and a statement. The statement should cover their interest in the program including the posts they've lived in, the grade they will be entering in fall, the school activities they participate in, and a brief essay on what they have learned from/enjoyed about living the Foreign Service life.
