The Foreign Service Youth Foundation is committed to supporting Foreign Service Youth by providing them with opportunities to challenge themselves, reflect upon their Foreign Service childhoods, and to be celebrated for their achievements. Since 2010, FSYF has been recognizing Foreign Service High School Seniors and Gap-Year dependents for their outstanding achievements through the FSYF/STG Academic Merit Award.

This year, FSYF is offering a one-time only competitive merit-based award with a first place prize of \$4,000 and a second place prize of \$2,000. High school seniors and gap year dependents whose families are members of the Foreign Service Youth Foundation (FSYF) are eligible to apply. (*Verify membership eligibility at <u>www.fsyf.org</u>)*

Deadline

All application materials must be received by FSYF by Monday, February 5, 2018.

Judging

Judging Panels are composed of members of the FSYF Board of Directors and the volunteers from the Foreign Service community.

Notification Date

Applicants will be notified by email of the results by Friday, April 13, 2018. Awards are bestowed in July 2018.

Expectations of Winning Applicants

Scholarship Winners will be asked to:

- I. Provide a short bio and personal photo that will appear in various Foreign Service news outlets;
- 2. Permit their essay to be published on the FSYF website or in FSYF publications;
- 3. Play a role in one of many ways to support the Mission of the Foreign Service Youth Foundation, including:
 - Writing a brief article or blog about growing up in the Foreign Service
 - Serving on a Youth Panel for one of many workshops hosted by FSYF
 - Provide Advice to FSYF on how better to serve FS Youth OR
 - Other form of service to be agreed upon during consultation with FSYF





Checklist: for your Application to be Complete, it MUST Include:

- Application Form This form seeks information about you, the school(s) you have attended, your classes, extra-curricular activities and work experience. This form is a 4-page fillable PDF intended to be completed electronically. If you experience technical problems, please contact FSYF. If the space provided is not adequate, you may include supplemental pages as necessary.
- **Honor Statement** For your application to be considered the Honor Statement must be signed.
- □ **Academic Transcript** Provide the following:

1. **SAT and/or ACT Scores:** provide your scores in the following manner: From your relevant test's personal online account, save as a pdf the page on which both your name and scores appear and send it to FSYF as an electronic attachment, or print and include it in your mailed application. Judges will consider only your highest scores.

2. Official Transcript: For your transcript to be considered official, it must be either mailed or e-mailed directly to FSYF from your school, or, if mailed by applicant, arrive in envelope sealed and signed by your school guidance department. If you attend a non-American school, obtain an equivalent record. Transcripts from 9th, 10th, 11th and the first semester of 12th must be included.

Essay - Write a minimum of one page, but no longer than two-page, double-spaced (Times New Roman I2-point font) essay on:

"How has growing up as a Foreign Service Third-Culture Kid (TCK) influenced your choice of college, major and ambitions?"

Spelling, grammar, content, and creativity will be taken into consideration when scoring essays. **Your name must be on the essay.**

- Membership FSYF family membership dues must be current as of Monday, February 05, 2018 for your application to be considered. To join FSYF please see our website at: <u>www.fsyf.org</u>
- Deadline: All submissions must be received by FSYF no later than Monday, February 05, 2018.

INCOMPLETE applications will **NOT** be considered for this award. **The applicant is solely** responsible for the on-time delivery of all required material.
