- 1. Summary: The Foreign Service Youth Foundation (FSYF) is pleased to announce its award winners for 2020. Due to the ongoing pandemic, FSYF will not be hosting its annual award ceremony. FSYF will honor the awardees via the Family Liaison Office (FLO) website, newsletter, and social media platforms. FSYF commends the hard work and creativity of the 199 young community members who participated this year, and thanks FLO, the Overseas Briefing Center (OBC), contest judges, and contest award donors for their support of this program.
- 2. About FSYF: Since 1989, FSYF has helped Foreign Service youth embrace the adventure of an internationally mobile childhood by encouraging resilience and fostering camaraderie. Global programs include webinars on Third Culture Kid issues, a Foreign Service youth-written newsletter, annual contests, and scholarships for college-bound seniors. D.C.-area events in previous years have included re-entry seminars for high school and middle school students, a college admissions workshop, family meet-up events, and a fall welcome back picnic. 7. **OBC KidVid Awards**: The OBC, a division of the Foreign Service Institute Transition Center, and FSYF are the co-sponsors of this annual contest. The 2020 contest was remarkable in many ways. Due to COVID-19, OBC revised the standard guidelines to ask Foreign Service youth to capture what life is like coping with a worldwide pandemic. In response, OBC received an unprecedented 40 entries produced by 59 youth from every region of the world. Below are the 17 top winners. An additional 35 Honorable Mentions are listed in 20 State 62352 dated July 2, 2020 (Reftel). OBC coordinates the contest, and FSYF provides the prize money through a donation from Meghan Pachas of MAP Property Solutions, LLC. Prizes range from \$50 to \$300.
